

Pinehaven School Values Launch 2024

Throughout 2023 we worked alongside our tamariki, staff and community to construct our new school values. In crafting these values, our goal was to ensure they are student-friendly, engaging, consistent school-wide, and each accompanied by a visual cue to serve as a constant reminder. As you can see we are still working on the visuals and could do with a bit of design help. If you are a graphic designer and able to volunteer some time to create visuals related to each value, I would love to hear from you!

This term our value is *Uphold Mana*. Before school started this year, teachers worked together to unpack these values in readiness to teach our tamariki. They came up with three simple bullet points related to each value, see this terms example. Our values will be taught throughout the year, and it would be great if you could discuss these with your child/ren at home, so that we have a shared vocabulary between home and school.





Phones Away For the Day

You will have heard in the media that schools have been mandated to implement a phone rule that has student phones 'away for the day' as soon as possible in Term 1 2024 and no later than the start of Term 2 2024. At Pinehaven School we do not recommend students bring personal devices to school. If students do bring a phone to school it is expected that these are not for use during the school day and must be turned off and out of sight. Please take this opportunity to remind your children that if they need to contact you during the school day they should speak to their teacher in the first instance or come to the school office.



Movin' March, 4-8 March

To encourage active travel to school, we are encouraging everyone to walk, cycle, scoot or skateboard to school the week of 4 March - 8 March. Each morning during Movin' March week, participating students will have a special ticket that will be marked by their teacher in class or at the gate by a designated student helper. Spot prizes will be awarded to some students as they come through the gates. All active students can hand their cards in at the
